All financial support subject to status and availability of funding.

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is intended to provide financial support to help students overcome the specific financial barrier to participation they face so that they can remain in education. The Bursary is made up of two parts: the student support funding and the free meals funding.

The student support fund can be used to help students with the essential costs of participating in their study programme. It's not intended to support extra-curricular activities or provide learning support, mentoring, counselling or extra tutoring. It is not intended to cover living costs.

Please refer to the table on page 3 which is a guide to what support is available.

GRANTS AND BURSARIES

All students regardless of where they live and where household income is less than £31,200 per year are eligible to apply for a general bursary worth up to £650. Payment of the bursary is in kind and may include help towards the cost of equipment and College trips which are essential to their course.

VULNERABLE STUDENT SUPPORT

Another form of bursary of up to £1,200 per year is available to vulnerable students who are in care, care leavers, students in receipt of Universal Credit/Income Support or disabled students in receipt of both Universal Credit and Personal Independence Payment. Payment will be made in kind, eg, subsidy towards the cost of food and drinks in the College café, travel support or help towards the cost of equipment and College trips etc.

The fund is intended to help students with the essential costs of participating in their study programme. It's not intended to support extra-curricular activities or provide learning support, mentoring, counselling or extra tutoring. It is not intended to cover living costs.

FREE COLLEGE MEALS

For students where household income includes Universal Credit payments help towards the cost of food and drinks in College, worth a maximum of £5 per day, is available via the student catering app.

TRANSPORT BURSARIES

Students living more than 2 miles from College and with household income up to £41,600 per year can also claim financial assistance towards the cost of travel to College. Some students could also qualify for a free College bus pass – please refer to the table.

ARMED FORCES BEREAVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

COMPUTER LOANS

If you do not have a computer at home, the College may be able to lend you one for the duration of your course. Preference is given to students who are receiving financial assistance from the College.

LOCAL AUTHORITY ASSISTANCE

Your home local authority may be able to provide financial assistance in certain circumstances. Each authority applies different rules and assists in different ways. Please contact your local authority to find out about arrangements they have in place for financial assistance.

Examples of local authority assistance include:

- If a student lives in an area where there is no public transport service, the council may be able to provide transport to link up with either the nearest public service or with one of the College buses.
- North Yorkshire Council currently subsidise some students living in North Yorkshire who can demonstrate that their course at QE is necessary for their future career and is not available at a nearer school or college. In exceptional circumstances NYC will pay for a place on a QE bus.

CARE TO LEARN

If you are under 20 and have one or more children, Care to Learn can help with the cost of childcare and related travel costs while you are learning. You could receive up to £180 per child per week.
